The Georgia Environmental Protection Division (EPD) has reviewed the March 30, 2010 Voluntary Remediation Plan (VRP) Application Form and Checklist, which has been submitted in lieu of a compliance status report (CSR) for the above referenced qualifying property.


Your proposal to satisfy the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Rules by removing the wood waste from the property within 90-days of submitting the VRP application form and checklist is hereby approved. Therefore, the wood waste must be removed from the property by June 29, 2009. Following wood waste removal, you must submit documentation of the wood waste removal activities, complete with a narrative and photographs.

However, the VRP application form and checklist submitted for the property has been determined unacceptable because you did not include a voluntary remediation plan. A 2007 CSR, which EPD previously commented on (EPD letter dated September 11, 2007), is not a voluntary remediation plan. In order to be considered for the voluntary remediation program, you must:

1. Remove the wood waste from the property by June 29, 2010.
2. Submit a new VRP application form and checklist (available at [http://www.georgiaepd.org/Documents/epdforms\\_hwb.html#voluntary](http://www.georgiaepd.org/Documents/epdforms_hwb.html#voluntary)) within 30-days from removing the wood waste or no later than July 29, 2010. The VRP application form and checklist must include a preliminary site conceptual model. Please note the new VRP application form and checklist should not contain information regarding biological data, which are not regulated substances.

Provided you complete the wood waste removal and submit a new VRP application form and checklist by the deadlines specified, we will not consider you in violation of the Georgia Rules for Hazardous Site Response. If you have any questions, please contact Kristen Ritter Rivera at (404) 657-8600.
