The questions here must be answered to determine if you are a covered fleet.

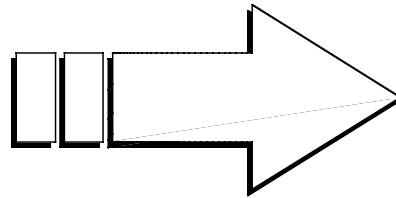


This area will walk you through the steps for answering the question. Often, there are several steps to each question. Spaces are available for you to record information.

The direction box will direct you to the next question, based on answers to the current question.

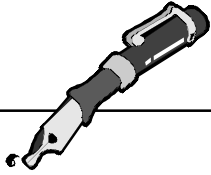

Covered Fleets

Question 1-1:

How many of the vehicles in your fleet operate in the 13 county area of the Clean Fueled Fleets Program?

The **area covered** under Georgia's Clean Fueled Fleets Program (CFFP) is the 13 county Atlanta nonattainment area:

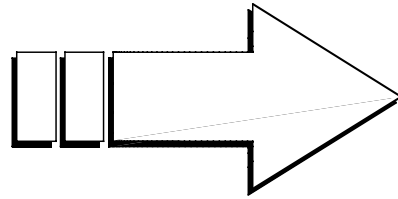

Several classes of vehicles are covered by the CFFP based on their Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR):

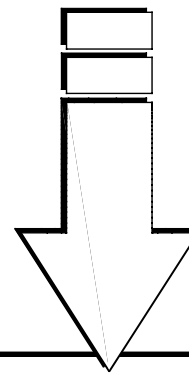
- **Light Duty Vehicles** (under 8,500 lbs. GVWR)
- **Light Duty Trucks** (under 8,500 lbs. GVWR)
- **Heavy Duty Vehicles** (8,501 - 26,000 lbs. GVWR)

"Operate In" - Any vehicle that travels 50% or more of its total annual miles within the 13 county area. Even vehicles that are based outside of the covered area may "operate in" the covered area.

If the total from **1b** is **10 or greater**, please go to **Question 1-2**.



If the total from **1b** is **less than 10**, you are not covered by the Clean Fueled Fleets Program at this time.

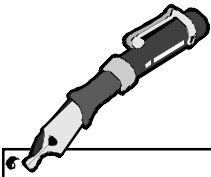


You do not have to purchase any Clean Fueled Vehicles (CFVs) at this time. However, should the total from **1b** become 10 or greater at a later date, it is your responsibility to register your fleet with the EPD within 90 days and meet purchase requirements. **Please refer to the supplement for non-covered fleets.**

Covered Fleets

Question 1-2:

How many exempt vehicles do you operate in your fleet?

2c Subtract the number of exempt vehicles (2b) from the total vehicles (2a). _____ This is your non-exempt fleet.

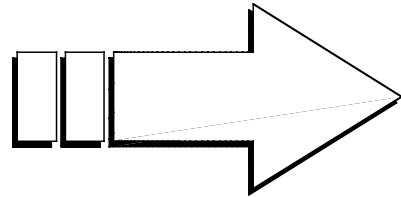
Exempt Vehicles

All of the following categories of vehicles are considered to be exempt from the CFFP requirements.

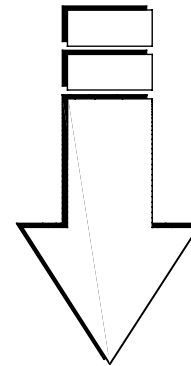
1. Vehicles held for lease or rental to the public.
2. Vehicles held for sale by dealerships, including demonstration vehicles.
3. Vehicles used for manufacturer product evaluations or tests.
4. Law enforcement and emergency vehicles.
5. Non-road vehicles, including farm and construction vehicles.
6. Vehicles greater than 26,000 lbs. GVWR.
7. Vehicles that are garaged at a personal residence and are not being centrally fueled.

Do not double count any exempt vehicle - include in one category only.

If the number of non-exempt vehicles (2c) is **10 or greater**, please go to **Question 1-3**.



If the number of non-exempt vehicles (2c) is **less than 10**, you are not covered by the CFFP at this time.

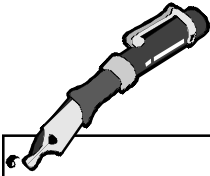


You do not have to purchase any Clean Fueled Vehicles (CFVs) at this time. However, should the total from 2c become 10 or greater at a later date, it is your responsibility to register your fleet with the EPD within 90 days and meet purchase requirements. **Please refer to the supplement for non-covered fleets.**

Question 1-3:

Is your fleet centrally fueled?

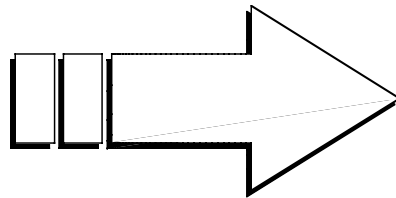
A **Centrally Fueled Fleet** is fueled 100% of the time at a location that is either:

1. Owned, operated or controlled by the fleet operator,
or
2. Under a contract fueling agreement with the covered fleet operator.

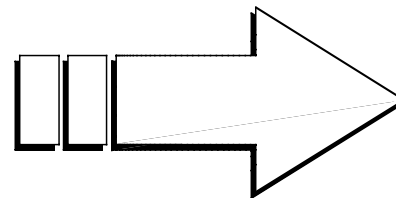
Note

- A corporate credit card for fueling is not considered “centrally fueled”.
- Holding a credit card agreement with a fueling company is not considered a “contract fueling agreement”.

If your answer to 3a is **yes**, you are a covered fleet operator. Go to **Section 3: Purchase Requirements** (Page 3-1).



If your answer to 3a is **no**, go to **Question 1-4**.



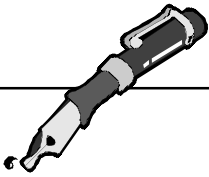
At this point, your fleet should consist of more than 10 non-exempt vehicles operating more than 50% of their annual mileage inside the 13 county Atlanta nonattainment area.

Covered Fleets

Question 1-4:

Is your fleet capable of being centrally fueled?

*NOTE: For the 1999 Model Year, all vehicles will be treated the same as if they are centrally fueled. The steps in **Section 2** will only apply for future model years.*



4a Number of vehicles in the fleet that are centrally fueled (3b). _____

4b Number of vehicles in your fleet capable of being centrally fueled*. _____

4c Add the number of vehicles that are capable of being centrally fueled to the vehicles in your fleet that are 100% centrally fueled (**4a**). _____

*The answer to **4b** can only be determined once the steps in **Section 2** have been completed. **Section 2** will walk you through the process of determining what portion of your fleet is "capable of being centrally fueled."

For the 1999 Model Year, all vehicles will be treated the same as if they are centrally fueled. Use the number from **3c** as the answer to **4b**.

Capable of being centrally fueled means a fleet that *could* be centrally fueled at the same location.

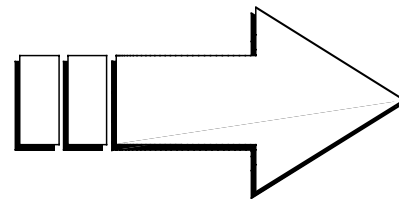
Fleets that are not currently centrally fueled are required to determine the number of non-exempt vehicles (from **3c**) that are capable of being centrally fueled.

Having one or more vehicles that are not capable of being centrally fueled does not exempt an entire fleet from the program. Those remaining vehicles that *could* be centrally fueled will count toward the ten vehicle requirement for covered fleets under the CFFP.

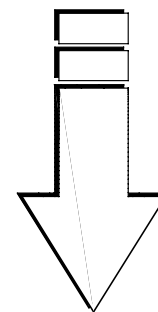
Your non-exempt fleet at this point is considered to be capable of being centrally fueled and subject to purchase requirements unless proven otherwise in **Section 2: "Capable of Being Centrally Fueled"**.

If the number from **4c** is **10 or greater**, you are a covered fleet operator. Please go to **Section 3: Purchase Requirements**

(Page 3-1).



If the number from **4c** is **less than 10** vehicles, you are not covered by the CFFP at this time.



You do not have to purchase any Clean Fueled Vehicles (CFVs) at this time.

However, should the total from **4c** become 10 or greater at a later date, it is your responsibility to register your fleet with the EPD within 90 days and meet purchase requirements. **Please refer to the supplement for non-covered fleets.**
